

Pineapple Cream Pie

2 cups (16 oz) Sour Cream
2 pkgs Instant Vanilla Pudding
 $\frac{3}{4}$ can (20 oz size) Pineapple, not drained
1 Tbsp Sugar
10-inch Graham Cracker Pie Crust

Beat all ingredients together slowly for one minute. Pour into graham cracker pie crust. Refrigerate for 4 hours or longer. Before serving, top with *Cool Whip*®

Note: *I have found that using only $\frac{3}{4}$ (removing 5 oz) of the can of pineapple provides the right amount of pineapple for this recipe. This pie may also be made a day ahead.*

Harman's Country Store

Harman's Country Store is a popular place to visit in Sugar Hill, New Hampshire. It is located in the village of Sugar Hill on Route 117 across from the Sugar Hill Historical Museum. The main part of the store was built in 1921. The part on the right was moved there around 1940. This addition was a blacksmith's shop. There also used to be a gas pump in the front of the building. The post office used to be in the far corner of the main store until about 1960. There is a computer and other things there now.

In 1954, John and Kate Harman bought the general store. Mr. and Mrs. Harman retired from New York City and bought it to start a mail order business. One day a salesman said that they had found some cheese that had been forgotten for two years. Mr. Harman ordered 1,000 pounds of the two year old cheddar cheese, and that's how their business became Harman's Cheese Store. Ever since then the cheese they sell has to be at least two years old. The Harmans died in 1980. Maxine Aldrich had worked for the Harmans since 1974. When Mr. Harman died, Mrs. Aldrich kept the business going, and she, with her husband Bert, became owners of Harman's Cheese Store in April of 1981.

Today Harman's is a popular place for tourists who come here because of the reputation of the cheese and because it's a very old building. It is also a popular place for Sugar Hill kids who like ice cream because Harman's also sells ice cream and a lot of other items. Mrs. Aldrich and the other workers are friendly and run a good business.

In 2001, Vincent wrote this report in 3rd grade. Today, Vincent is one of our "boys" that does chores around the store, like making boxes for the holiday season.
